Serving as a Board Member

When Deirdre, Nyra, and I first started attending UUCM, I had no intention of becoming significantly involved in the congregation in any way. I had already had my fill of organized religion and was still reluctant to even attend services, never mind play a role in supporting the congregation. However, I soon realized that this church was different from any other religion I had previously been exposed to, and I was intrigued. So, when Rev. Jan asked Deirdre and me what we could contribute to the congregation, I mentioned that I was good with numbers and would be willing to join the Finance Committee. Shortly after joining the Finance Committee, I ended up sharing the responsibilities of Finance Chair, as everyone on the committee was stretched too thin to serve in that role at the time. Several months later, we had a Finance Chair, but no Treasurer. So, I volunteered to serve in that role and continue to do so. In less than a year, I went from skeptically attending a few services to serving as a member of the Board.

At each step in this process I initially felt completely unprepared and incompetent. However, everyone on the Finance Committee and, later, the Board, were incredibly supportive and patient. They helped me adapt to each role and provided me with whatever assistance I needed. Everyone worked to make sure I was successful so that together we could help the congregation be successful.

Serving on both the Finance Committee and the Board of Trustees has given me the opportunity to serve and contribute to the congregation in the best way I can. It has also given me the chance to have a voice in how we as a congregation overcome challenges and what direction we should be moving in. It has, at times, proved challenging, but has ultimately been a rewarding experience. I would encourage anyone looking for a way to contribute to the congregation to join one of the committees or the Board. Even if you think there isn't anything you'd be good at, there is always something you can help with.

Social Justice Committee

Next meeting is May 13th at 9:00 AM– all welcome!

This past year, since September, 2017, we have been working on local issues of systemic racism. We began by asking the NAACP President, members of the Meriden Board of Education, and members of the Meriden City Council to come speak to us about what they see as the main issues and how we could be of help. We learned much that night, and, as one of our discussion group members said afterward, "In hindsight it seems so simple.... just ask people who don't have white privilege what they think we should do." So we have participated in many events and activities that reflect what we learned, i.e., immigration rallies and requesting specifics of the City Council during the "citizens speak" section at the start of each meeting. We will continue with discussions, and we hope to expand to the Board of Education meetings.

In addition we continue to learn about racism and our part in the systems of racism we live within all the time. We have been reading the UU Common Read, Centering: Navigating Race, Authenticity and Power. We have had one discussion, but the group wanted to continue to talk about the important concepts from the book. We will continue on Sunday, May 13, 12:30-2:30 PM and Sunday, June 17, 12:30-2:30 PM. We will continue to discuss the fact that most Unitarian Universalist congregations consist mostly of white members and what it must feel like to be a person of color in our settings. The discussions are open to everyone, whether they have attended the initial discussion or not.
